






2. Online Teaching during COVID-19 has been stressful.




3. How well were you able to maintain a work-life balance during online teaching?




4. How peaceful was your home environment during online teaching?




5. How important is face-to-face communication during online teaching?




6. How important is the role of technology in online teaching?







9. Do you think absence of classroom interaction with your students is a disadvantage? 17 responses




10. Online teaching does not take more time than classroom teaching 17 responses




11. There is adequate time to revise in online teaching.






13. The technology involved in online teaching is confusing








16. Students don't appreciate the efforts of the teacher during online teaching 17 responses








18. Are assignments completed within the stipulated time?




19. What method of tests do you adopt online?




20. Is online correction comparatively easier?


Parents's Feedback Analysis Report(2016-2021)


The Feedback from parents was developed both in English and in Tamil. The collected data was analysed for quality enhancement and development of the college.






























The following are the observations and suggestions given by the parents for the development of the college


- Separate building for the College (55%)
